BRIGHT HOPE FOR WOMEN

On a gray, cold, depressing January day in Fresno, the cheery yellow and white Naomi's House on the Poverello House campus is an uplifting sight for homeless single women such as Alisia. When she first signed in, Alisia remembers, "I was given a hot meal and a safe place to rest," This is similar to thousands of other women since Naomi's House opened in 2002. Alisia's bed was one of 28 overnight beds at the only low-barrier safe haven for homeless single women in Fresno County. According to the last Point in Time Count there are over 700 women homeless women living in Fresno County. Naomi's House provides that beacon of hope. Besides shelter, meals, showers, and clothing, offers, according to Alisia, "Naomi's House offers opportunities to rehabilitate from feelings of loss and loneliness." Case managers help women find housing, access mental health services and make positive life choices to achieve self-sufficiency. "Case management professionals like Rosemarie were very helpful, friendly and supportive. She understood my situation as well as my needs," says Alisia. "I was able to find suitable and more-permanent housing arrangements" and help with travel costs to attend meetings and keep appointments. Alisia says, she was provided "resources and materials that I desperately needed to ensure a healthy well-being for myself."

Rosemarie, a case manager at Naomi's House since 2014, says, "When Alisia began to see the light at the end of the tunnel, I could see the positive change in her. As a case manager, that is very fulfilling. What is rewarding for me is the day I can see the smile on my client's face as she walks into the new happy chapter of her life."



Generous donations from the community with gifts of money, clothing and other wish list items are part of the hope at Naomi's House. With hope restored, Alisia plans "to continue to seek advocacy, advice, and support from the staff, who make things a little easier when life seems to be moving at a rapid pace."
