Marcus was homeless for 23 years. After high school, Marcus became dependent on drugs and lost over 100 pounds. While living on the streets, he had been arrested multiple times. Change happened for Marcus in 2016, when he experienced several health crises that scared him, including an inability to walk due to severe leg cramps and improper shoes. Providence came through in the form of Poverello House's Multi-Agency Access Program (MAP), a service provided through Poverello House that links people to medical care, supportive services, job opportunities, substance abuse programs, and housing.

Along with receiving MAP services, Marcus was welcomed into Poverello House's Village of Hope, where he developed relationships with other clients who inspired him. During this time, he obtained a bike for which he used to get himself to work and back. With the help of his case manager, Marcus moved into his own apartment and is currently is part of the maintenance team there. After saving up his earnings, he purchased a car.

While most would assume his pride would be symbolized in his car, it came in the freedom of purchasing a pair of shoes. "It feels good to be able to buy a new pair of shoes," he says.

Marcus has big plans for the future - such as owning a business and maybe someday, a Harley. He knows that he'll get there with time, motivation, and small steps. "Blessings," says Marcus. "I can see the blessings now. I have a girlfriend, a job, and I want to help people."

He explains that homelessness ends with motivation. "You have to want it," he explains. "And I wanted it."
