I am pleased to share that Poverello House has much in store for those we serve in 2021. As we look ahead, there is much to look forward to. In the upcoming year, we plan to launch our Family Services Program, finish construction on our 903-panel solar project, complete a renovation of our state-of-the-art shower and laundry facility for clients and plenty more that is still in the planning stages. All of this is to say that the future is bright for Poverello House and those we serve. I believe that this community depends on us to further our work, our reach, and our mission. I am excited to share our vision for 2021 in the next newsletter.

### IN MEMORIAM OF JAMES "JIM" CONNELLY



Jim was born in Bakersfield on February 4, 1941. He served in the United States Marine Corps and later become a Certified Public Accountant. Jim's most personally meaningful work was born in 1973 when his friend Mike McGarvin founded Poverello House, a non-profit, nondenominational shelter that provided food and other essential services to those in need. He remained an active member until well into the late 2000s. Charles Farnsworth long time board member said, "Jim was a great board member, and I feel the Poverello House was blessed to have his experience and knowledge for all the years he was on the Board." John Frye Jr. Past Board Chair remembered that James provided meaningful counsel and financial insight which guided how the services were offered to individuals experiencing homelessness. "Jim was a friend to many and will be missed but not forgotten."
