Moving day was here. The sun was shining, and there was a feeling of joy in the air. Today the clients living in the sheds moved to the new pallet shelters. The Village of Hope, established in 2002, was in response to the encampments located on Santa Clara St. At the time, the sheds were the best option to get people experiencing homelessness off the streets and into a shelter. Almost twenty years later, Poverello House committed to improving the clients' living facilities. After researching various shelter options, the Pallet Shelters best suited our clients. Pallet Shelters provide a safe, open space for up to four people to occupy. It has heating and air conditioning and electrical outlets so clients can charge their phones. "This is such a blessing to get out of heat and cold," said a client. "We are so grateful." Transforming the Villages was made possible because of generous donors from the community and a commitment from the City of Fresno to end homelessness. The Village of Hope's Pallet Shelters provide people experiencing homelessness a respite from the streets as they work towards becoming vibrant members of our community.
