Being housed after being homeless is "like seeing a rainbow after a storm," said Barbara Smith, a recently housed client. Sometimes that storm lasts a long time. Lisa Watkins, for example, has been experiencing homelessness since 2000. This Thanksgiving, however, she is thankful that she has a place to call home. Shelly Forrest experienced a great amount of trauma while spending over 10 years experiencing homelessness. This Thanksgiving, she will be doing her favorite activity: cooking a meal for herself. After numerous years of living on the streets of Fresno, Charles will be biking to work from his home. He will also be able to pursue his passion for exercise.

Barbara, Shelly, Lisa, and Charles were housed through Poverello House's emergency shelter programs. From January 2022 to August 2022, Poverello House provided over 30,000 nights of shelter through the Village of Hope and Naomi's House. Everyone in the Village of Hope or Naomi's House is assigned a case manager. The case manager creates a plan for supportive services and permanent housing. Lisa is grateful for her case managers, Anthony Derr and Harold King, because "it's only because of them I was successful in housing." She also thanks Village staff member Jeff Moore for making her stay at the Villages "great." Shelly is looking forward to working with her Housing Stability Case Manager, Elaine. Weekly, Elaine will visit Shelly to ensure that she has food to cook, crafts to do, and access mental health services to address her trauma.

The memorial piece has been in the works for many months, with the help of "Mama Mary" and Clare McGarvin in developing the details. This memorial will feature a fountain and a glass mosaic of a moment captured during Mike's work on the streets of Fresno and a prominent display of his story and character. It will be a beautiful way for us to make sure that "Papa Mike" is never forgotten in our community.
