PAPA MIKE'S CAFE RE-OPENING

In 2018, Papa Mike's Cafe served its last meal - until now. Chef Emery Bish is bringing back the iconic experience for Poverello House clients.

Papa Mike's Cafe is a restaurant-style experience that Papa Mike McGarvin began in the late 1990s. Once a month, visiting clients were greeted by volunteers as waiters and

waitresses, to be served a three-course meal similar to that of a sit-down restaurant. On January 8, Poverello House Chef Bish, will be opening the doors to Papa Mike's Cafe.

"We really wanted to honor Papa Mike's legacy," said Bish. "We also wanted to give the clients an experience to dine with dignity - to come into an actual restaurant, and be served." Volunteers, sponsors for food, and in-kind donations are needed as the project continues.

Bish will also be starting a YouTube channel this January, where community members can learn the recipe that will be served that month at Papa Mike's Cafe. The first episode will feature a tutorial of Chef's meatball and marinara recipe.

ROASTED TURKEY BY CHEF BISH

Looking for a very moist and flavorful turkey for your holiday gatherings? Try this recipe, by Poverello House's very own Chef Emery Bish!

Ingredients:

- ☐ 1 turkey, thawed
- ☐ 8 stalks of celery, roughly chopped
- ☐ 2 onions, roughly chopped
- ☐ 2 large carrots, peeled & roughly chopped
- ☐ 1 oven roasting bag (not required)
- ☐ Salt & Pepper to taste

Directions: Chop vegetables and rinse the turkey in cold water. Place half of the vegetables in the turkey cavity and season the turkey with salt and pepper. Place the turkey in the roasting bag, and place the remaining vegetables into the bag, along with the turkey. Pour 2 cups of water in the bag with the turkey. Place the turkey in a roasting pan BREAST SIDE DOWN.

Roast 20 minutes per pound at 350 degrees.

The turkey is done cooking once the internal temperature is 175 degrees or above. Remove turkey from the oven and let it rest for 15 to 20 minutes. After the turkey has rested, it is time to carve the bird. Remove turkey from the pan to prepare for carving, then drain and strain pan juices for a delicious gravy. Serve and enjoy.

Note: If you use disposable pan this makes for easy cleanup.
