

MESSAGE FROM OUR CED

Friends of Poverello House,

Happy New Year! We have officially arrived in 2025! Before we look forward, I want to reflect on the incredible year we just finished at Poverello House. There is so much to celebrate, but I will focus on two huge things.

First and foremost, last year, we opened Papa Mike's Café in January! Guests have had a dignified dining experience unlike any other in our community. We have

had countless guests experiencing homelessness and hunger who have an experience that changes their outlook on life at Papa Mike's Café. I have personally seen our guests show gratitude through tears. They had not been reminded of their dignity for a long time. They were reminded when they had their Papa Mike's Burger served to them just like they ordered it! I want to thank everyone who has helped make this possible this year. The road has not been an easy one. Running a restaurant is challenging and expensive. Yet, we served 307,760 meals at Papa Mike's Café in 2024. I assure you that it was all worth it.

In 2024, we also saw the expansion of the Men's Rehab Program in partnership with the California Reinvestment Grant Program. Our program was just one of five programs in the state to receive the maximum award. This allowed us to add a case manager, mental health support, overnight staff, a job developer, and more. We have already seen the impact this expansion has made. In 2024, we had 72 men graduate from the program. That is more than we have ever had graduate in a given year.

Most importantly, we are continuing to work hard daily to end homelessness. In fact, "ending homelessness, one person at a time" is our theme for this year. In 2024, we ended homelessness for 460 households. That means that 460 households ended their homelessness journey for good! Everything we do is about this very outcome.

There is much to look forward to in 2025. I am thrilled to share that we will move our Naomi's House operations to the Holy Cross Center for Women! The current Naomi's House facility is far beyond its useful life. The new facility will provide dramatically better accommodations, a dedicated greenspace, a large kitchen, and much more! Through a generous grant from The Isnardi Foundation, we can cover the costs of the necessary renovations. We hope to have the women in the new facility by May.

I am also excited to share that we are beginning the process of building a new home for the Men's Rehab Program on the main campus! The current facility is comprised of more than 30-year-old modular trailers. They have served our needs well. It is time to invest in men in our community pursuing the best versions of themselves. I will share more details as they become available this year.

As you can see, this success does not happen in a vacuum. Much of this would be impossible without public and private partnerships that make it all possible. This would not be possible without you! In 2024, the community provided over 62,000 volunteer hours to serve those experiencing homelessness. Many of you who receive this newsletter donate financially. Many of you bring your used clothing, do collection drives, and help in other ways. We all share in the success because we are all part of it.

I look forward to continuing that partnership with you in 2025. Here's to another incredible year at Poverello

House as we continue to end homelessness, one person at a time.
