POVERELLO HOUSE 50 YEARS OF HOPE

In 2023, Poverello House celebrated 50 years of dedicated service to the unhoused and poverty-stricken individuals in Fresno County. During this monumental year, staff remained committed to the mission of believing in the dignity of every person. The organization accomplished a great deal, including renovating our kitchen and dining room, onboarding over 100 staff, opening two new shelters, and introducing a new program.

In honor of our founder, a Memorial was constructed to ensure that the story of "Papa Mike" and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches will never be forgotten. The beautiful mosaic-mural and fountain structure was built in the campus courtyard. For those who knew him, they can remember him. For those who did not, they can learn about who he was and the impact he made in this community.

To preserve his story, Poverello House reprinted 50th editions of Mike McGarvin's works, his collection of photography, entitled "On the Level: Walking the Streets with Mike McGarvin," and his

autobiography "Papa Mike." We displayed his love of photography at the Art Hop event in May. honor of Mike's legacy, three local photographers endeavored to recreate his vision of raising awareness of the unhoused community. Mike's photographs, which he captured during his years of service, are both powerful and enduring. They inspire us to serve those in need.

Poverello House commemorated our 50th Anniversary with a celebration to honor all past and present volunteers, donors, board members, and community members who have supported the organization. The event featured the Poverello House Mobile Café, which served PB&J-inspired sliders, chili cups, and mushroom hors d' oeuvres.

The event was also a moment to recognize community members who have had a profound and lasting impact on the organization. There is a very long list of these special people!

During the 2023 Gift of Hope Gala, we recognized a remarkable individual who made an incredible impact on Poverello House. Mary McGarvin's unwavering support and love for Mike provided him with the motivation and encouragement to pursue his goals with Poverello House. The first-ever "Papa Mike McGarvin Humanitarian Award" was presented to Mary at the Gala. Who could be a better awardee than the woman who stood by her husband's side from the very first day?


NEW YEAR, NEW PROGRAM, NEW SHELTERS.

Poverello House has marked its milestone 50th anniversary by opening two new shelters and a client services program. These new off-site shelters include the Family Hope Shelter and Hope Pointe Shelter. This year also saw the launch of the Street Navigation program.

On April 25th, the Family Hope Shelter officially opened its doors. Poverello House has always served families, but had never operated an emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness. The shelter caters to unhoused families, offering critical resources and case management to aid in securing permanent housing. Situated in a private location, the ambiance of the shelter ensures a safe and comfortable stay for up to 9 families at a time. Additionally, the shelter provides three daily meals, personal apartment units, and laundry services. The dedicated staff at Family Hope Shelter are committed to delivering personalized and compassionate care to every family. They also work tirelessly to ensure each family has a plan for securing permanent housing. The Family Hope Shelter is undoubtedly a beacon of hope for unhoused families in our community.

Through a partnership with the City of Fresno, Hope Pointe Shelter began welcoming clients on June 12th. The primary objective of this shelter is to assist clients in attaining document-readiness and transitioning to permanent housing within a 90-day timeframe. Hope Pointe Shelter provides case management and client services to help residents regain their footing. The shelter provides three meals daily, enrichment events, and overnight activities to ensure residents are comfortable during

their stay. Hope Pointe Shelter has the capacity to accommodate up to 127 clients. By integrating housing, case management, and client services, Hope Pointe Shelter aims to empower its residents to overcome homelessness.

The Street Navigation program is an innovative program that assists anyone who is unhoused with navigating directly from the streets to permanent housing. The program was designed because there are not enough emergency shelter beds in Fresno to serve everyone who is experiencing homelessness. However, there are still ways to secure housing without going through a shelter bed. The team also includes a Street Clinician, who provides clinical mental health services directly on the street. The Street Navigation program has a holistic approach to finding solutions to homelessness.

Just this month, the Street Navigation Program celebrated its first housed client! Cynthia Espinoza, Street Navigation Specialist, worked with Alfonzo from August 2023 to January 2024, Alfonzo shared that he had experienced homelessness for several years and struggled to find success with previous shelters and case management programs. He shared that he needed more encouragement and hands-on assistance. By working with Street Navigation, Alfonzo could receive case management in his preferred locations. This helped him to stay on course with his documentation and housing services. He noted that Cynthia provided a great deal of encouragement and assisted him in reconnecting with the Department of Behavioral Health to address his mental health needs.
